What will I learn?

The Cambridge Technical is for learners who are interested in learning about the performing arts sector alongside other fields of study, with a view to progressing to a wide range of higher education courses, not necessarily in Performing Arts. It is designed to be 360 Guided Leaning Hours and

is equivalent in size to one A Level.

You will learn a range of performance techniques through the study and replication of existing work. You will have the chance to perform to a range of audiences in a range of different roles. You will also have the chance to create your own original work.
