



Supporting your child through their French GCSE

Supporting with French revision:

All the papers on either tier require a good breadth of vocabulary knowledge, confident independent use of grammar and a range of question type strategies at hand. All content from any part of the course may be assessed on each of the four papers. Here are some tips:

- Ensure your child completes homework set.
- Encourage your child to attend intervention sessions.
- Remind them that room 11 is open every Wednesday and Thursday lunch time for one to one support and revision.
- Ensure active French revision is included into a regular revision cycle timetable. Including listening the revision guide has a CD; there are also listening sections on the websites below.
- Ensure they cover all of the topics in their revision not just the ones they find easy.
- Expect them to be learning spellings/vocabulary regularly and offer to test them to help them check their progress.
- Test your child on their speaking answers, listen/prompt/encourage them whilst you read their answers and they speak.

The students who feel best equipped in the exam are those who are regularly building their vocabulary base, tackling harder listening and reading questions and applying feedback they are given on written and spoken answers as part of their revision at home and in lesson. Students should try and include a weekly slot for these activities at home in order to build their understanding and confidence before the exam. Students should discuss any problems or concerns with their teachers.

Top Tips for Speaking Exams

Role Play

- Keep it SIMPLE
- Only give the information required
- Make sure you can ASK a question

- s'il vous plaît = please (vous)
- s'il te plaît = please (tu)
- 3. Je voudrais = I would like
- 4. Tu as/Vous avez = Do you have..?
- Tu aimes/Vous aimez = Do you like..?
- 6. Tu es/Vous êtes = You are/Are you..?
- 7. Où est = where is?
- 8. If y a = There is/Is there?



- I. sur la photo = in the photo
- je vois = I see
- de gauche à droite = from left to right
- 4. c'est = it is
- probablement = probably
- peut-être = maybe
- en train de +INF = in the middle of +INF
- à mon avis = in my opinion
- est = is
- 10. sont = are
- 11. ils sourient = they are smiling

Photo card

- Keep it SIMPLE
- Give an OPINION
- Explain ONE opinion
- Give a LONGER response to ONE question.

General Conversation

- Use some FANCY phrases
- Give as much information as you can
- Make sure you include OPINIONS and REASONS
- Use a VARIETY of time frames and vocab.

- 1. En ce qui concerne... = as far as ... is concerned
- 2. Et après y être arrivé = and after arriving there
- Après avoir fait cela = after having done that
- 4. Pendant que je faisais cela = whilst I was doing that
- Il faut que je vous dise que = I must tell you that
- Selon moi = in my opinion
- 7. Ce que j'ai aimé le plus = what I liked the most
- 8. Ce que j'ai aimé le moins = what I liked the least
- J'ai toujours voulu +INF = I've always wanted +INF
